



It is both a precious blessing and a unique nallenge that I have been charged with the osition of long- term follow-up nurse for NSC isayas. Long-term follow up signals ogressive move forward in the Newbo reening Program, with increasing emphasi ow being put on ensuring that babies who ave been saved by newborn screenir ontinue to grow healthy and develop normally This can be accomplished by the regula onitoring of patients for treatment compliance nd timely visits with their pediatric specialists.

Herein lies the challenge of long- term follow p: getting parents and caregivers empowered enough to want to pursue continued treatmen their children despite the financial and eographic difficulties. There is also the roblem of hard-to-locate patients because o naccessible or invalid contact numbers and ddresses and migration. Nevertheless, wit the dedication and cooperation of the NSC follow-up team, DOH representatives, and local ealth care workers, most of these patients are entually located. Getting parents to comply th treatment, however, is another enormous nallenge. In this instance, the importance of oper health education is given as early as th enatal period.

In spite of the difficulties, the rewards are ncomparable. There is that invaluable feeling of atisfaction when mothers say that they are hankful that through newborn screening, the children have been spared from the terrors o their disease and have otherwise been allowed e chance to live normal and healthy lives. In compliance with the Implementing Rules and Regulations of R.A. 9288, otherwise known as the Newborn Screening Act of 2004 which states, "adequate and sustained NBS services such as information, education, communication, screening, recall and follow-up should be provided in all LGU Health Facilities." the Center for Health Development Region 1 spearheaded a series of Newborn Screening Training intended for local government facilities, particularly rural health units.
