Newborn Screening in the Secondary Curriculum

From 1996 to 2004, there has been a steady increase in the number of newborns screened. Enactment of RA 9288 in 2004 gave way for more facilities to launch their newborn screening programs resulting to considerable increase of newborns screened toward 2006.

From 2006 onwards, there had been a steady increase of screening activity among the newborn screening facilities. Linking the current screening rate with 2012 screening coverage, the NBS system shows that it is close to saturating all of the facilitybased deliveries.

The 49.6% coverage is above halfway from the target that was set in 2010 which is 85%. Home births still remains a challenge posting 55.4% of the Philippines' annual live birth population. A significant task for the DOH and other NBS implementers is to have all babies delivered at hospitals and health facilities. This would also ensure that each of these newborns delivered will have the necessary newborn care. Thus, guaranteeing a greater coverage for newborn screening.

1.3. Regional Scenario

In general, the number of newborn Torces screened increased in all regions.

- The top three regions are the following: 1. Cordillera Administrative Region
- (CAR) 73.19%
- 2. Regions 6 (Western Visayas) -70.85%)
- 3. Region 11 (Davao) 67.94%




Figure 2: NBS coverage per region using the live birth data of 2008 (NSCB 2011).




Figure 1: Newborn screening count and coverage rate in relation to annual live birth from 1999 to 2012. The NSO 2008 data was used in computing for the coverage rate.
