↑ That is expanded newborn screening?

The expanded newborn screening program will increase the creening panel of disorders from six (6) to twenty-eight (28) This will provide opportunities to significantly improve the quality of life of affected newborns through facilitating early diagnosis

What are the additional disorders tested by expanded newborn

Aside from the six conditions in the present panel—Congenital vpothyroidism, Congenital Adrenal Hyperplasia, Galactosemia. Phenylketonuria, Maple Syrup Urine Disease, and Glucose-6 Phosphate Dehydrogenase deficiency—expanded newborn screening will screen for additional disorders falling under various groups of conditions, namely, hemoglobinopathies disorders of amino acid and organic acid metabolism, disorders of fatty acid oxidation, disorders of carbohydrate metabolism disorders of biotin metabolism, and cystic fibrosis

How much is the fee for expanded newborn screening?

Expanded newborn screening will be offered as an option t parents in all newborn screening facilities. The first option is creening for the six disorders at P550, which is included in the newborn care package for PhilHealth members, and the second option is screening for the full complement of 28 disorders at

Is expanded screening covered by PhilHealth?

Currently, only P550 is covered by PhilHealth. If the parent who is a PhilHealth member opts to have his or her baby undergo expanded newborn screening, the parent will pay the remaining cost which is P950

Philippines Celebrates Newborn Screening Awareness Week

On January 20, 2004, by virtue of Proclamation No. 540, President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo declared the first week of October as the National Newborn Screening Awareness Week, mobilizing the Department of Health (DOH) and its partners to organize activities that promote the newborn screening program.

Started as early as September, this year's celebration lasted until the end of October. The Newborn Screening Centers (NSCs), DOH-Regional Offices, Newborn Screening Reference Center (NSRC), and Volunteer Youth Leaders for Health (VYLH) in partnership with various program advocates conducted local and nationwide activities to increase public awareness on the benefits of newborn screening.

VYLH started the celebration in the Visayas region with the education on Newborn Screening, Folic Acid Supplementation and Rare Disease Support conducted at Bayawan and Negros Occidental High Schools. Other activities in the region included the feature on the GMA show Arangkada and Radyong Bayan on October 2 and door-todoor brochure distribution to residents of Brgy. Canday-ong, Dumaguete City, headed by VYLH-Dumaguete on October 6, among others.

In southern Philippines, highlights included a series of community outreach programs organized by NSC-Mindanao and DOH-ROs and a fun run in Cagayan de Oro City.

Up north, a series of activities included filter card distribution to newborn screening facilities, parents' fora, NBS trainings, and a trimedia campaign. In Metro Manila, the NSC-NIH and DOH-NCR held a mass screening in Novaliches District Hospital and Rizal Medical Center on October 17 and October 24, respectively, while the 12th National Newborn Screening Convention with the theme "Widening the Scope: Implementing the Expanded Newborn Screening Program" was held on October 28 and 29.
